

Dear Colleagues,

This was a very active year for the Interdisciplinary Toxicology Program (ITP). This included a very engaging and fun Fall Retreat where we welcomed several new students and faculty. We moved on from there to the 2017 Fall Southeastern Society of Toxicology Meeting at Fort Valley State University, where several of our students won awards for both oral and poster presentations. We then moved to the 2018 Annual Meeting of the Society of Toxicology in San Antonio. We, along with the Southeastern Society of Toxicology, sponsored a very successful mixer that was attended by toxicologists from all over the nation, and included several UGA alumni. It was a great success and I really enjoyed seeing both alumni and old friends.

Our annual Spring Retreat was highlighted by our Plenary Speakers. Our first was Dr. Lois Lehman-McKeeman, Vice President of Pharmaceutical Candidate Optimization at Bristol-Myers Squibb and a Past-President of the Society of Toxicology. Our other Plenary Speaker was Dr. Patricia Ganey of Michigan State University, the current President of the Society of Toxicology. One of the highlights was the workshop session held the day before where both speakers took questions from students and discussed their own career path.

This past summer ITP partnered with the Department of Environmental Health Sciences to host a 2-day workshop on manuscript writing presented by the Nature Masterclasses Initiative. This workshop was supported by funds from the University of Georgia Graduate School and approximately 25 students and several faculty members from both Environmental Health Sciences and ITP were in attendance. The feedback was very positive, and much kudos goes to Dr. Erin Lipp and Dr. John Wagner for their efforts to aid our graduate students.

I am pleased to announce that Dr. Jia-Sheng Wang, ITP member, Georgia Athletic Association Professor and Department Head of Environmental Health Sciences was awarded the 2018 Translational Impact Award from the Society of Toxicology. This is an incredible and well deserved honor. Our students also won several awards and I invite you to browse their awards and presentations listed in this newsletter. 

FACULTY RESEARCH HIGHLIGHTS

Dr. Robert Bringolf is an aquatic toxicologist in the Warnell School of Forestry & Natural Resources who seeks to improve understanding of the effects of environmental pollutants on aquatic organisms such as fish and freshwater mussels. Dr. Bringolf's research and teaching interests stem from a sense of calling to environmental stewardship. He and his students are currently working on projects that include:

1) evaluating reproductive and developmental effects of nitrate in fish and freshwater mussels,

2) identifying individual and environmental factors associated with the occurrence of intersex fish,

3) evaluating the toxicity of major ion salts to common and rare species of freshwater mussels, and

4) assessing the effects of and potential for trophic transfer of a neurotoxin produced by a recently described cyanobacteria in aquatic systems.

Dr. Bringolf's promotion to Professor becomes effective on July 1 and he was recently named Associate Dean for Academic Affairs in the Warnell School. He plans to stay connected with students by remaining active in teaching and research, though in a reduced capacity.

Dr. Huang's research interest focuses on catalysis involved in the environmental transformation of organic pollutants, and development of catalysis-based technology for pollution control and environmental remediation and management. His laboratory has been actively involved in four cutting-edge research topics:

1)enzyme-based technology for water/wastewater treatment and soil remediation 2)electrochemical and reactive electrochemical membrane processes in wastewater treatment

3) catalysis in biofuel production and agro-ecosystem management

4) environmental application and implication of nanomaterials

He has published over 110 peer-reviewed journal articles, 5 book chapters and 5 patent applications. He taught three courses at the University Georgia: Introduction to Water Quality, Environmental Measurement, and Advanced Instrumental Analysis in Environmental Studies.
